Takeaway 1: For our online students, the lack of shared physical spaces can significantly impact their university experience limiting opportunities for spontaneous interactions, collaborative study sessions, and forming friendships, potentially leading to feelings of social isolation.

Takeaway 2: Utilising the Gather Town platform, UNE Life has created a virtual campus for UNE online students, including informal study rooms and social spaces. A program of virtual study sessions and social connection programs is being implemented to encourage student engagement.

Assessment:

- While we wouldn't recommend that the Virtual Campus be utilised as a standard assessment offering, UNE Life is happy to facilitate alternative assessments or work-integrated-learning opportunities.

Student Engagement:

- The platform takes content that has been already created and displays it in a fun, engaging environment. Websites, hosted videos, PDFs, images, and 3D renderings can be utilised to create a sense of discovery and engagement.
- Spaces have been created to allow a variety of engagement opportunities for students including study spaces, UNE student support resources, and a variety of social event spaces such as a cultural centre, student bar, and pine forest.
